Your ticket for...

Information and materials all students will need to bring to complete the FAFSA or Dream Act application:



- Student and parent (if applicable) Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID)
 - Create and FSA ID at fsaid.ed.gov
 - Each one (student and parent) needs one!
- Not necessary for Dream Act applicants
- Student's Social Security card and drivers license (or government-issued ID), if available
- Parent's Social Security card (if available)
- Parent's federal income tax return** from tax year 2017
- Records of untaxed income** such as child support, TANF, interest income, veterans non-education benefits, Social Security benefits
- Student's 2017 federal income tax return, or evidence of income earned (W-2 form or pay records)
- Bank account records or statements
- Records of stocks, bonds or investments
- Business records
- If not a US citizen, bring alien registration card (if available)
- A list of the colleges you are interested in

STUDENTS! 2.0 **GPA** MINIMUM + 2 **Applications:** 1. FAFSA or Dream Act
2. GPA Verification + 1 **Deadline:** March 2, 2019 = **Up to \$12,570**

Foster Youth are encouraged to attend to get help with the Chafee Grant application!

REMEMBER!

To apply for a Cal Grant you must submit the FAFSA or Dream Act application and Cal Grant GPA verification. Public high schools and public charter schools are required to submit their current senior year students' certified GPAs, unless the parent or student has opted out. **Verify with your school!**
