What's on the PSAT test?

Section 1: Reading Test 60 min.

Section 2: Writing & Language Test 35 min.

Section 3: Math Test (No calculator) 25 min.

Section 4: Math Test (With calculator) 45 min.

Quick Facts

- All Reading Test questions are multiple choice and based on passages.
- Most math questions will be multiple choice, but some - called grid-ins - ask you to come up with the answer rather than select the answer.
- When you take the Writing and Language Test, you'll do three things that people do all the time when they write and edit; *read, find mistakes and weaknesses, and fix them.*

National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test: A.K.A. the PSAT (11th grade only)

Each year, over 3.4 million high school students take the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test, also known as the PSAT. This test helps you prepare for the SAT while determining your eligibility for a National Merit Scholarship.

The PSAT offers you the chance to improve your test-taking skills with no negative consequences; your results will have no bearing on college admissions or your high school transcript. And if you do well, you could earn more than bragging rights - you could win money for college.
